

IN THE MATTER OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT – ALBERTA
ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

To: HeatherGlen Golf Course Ltd.

(the “**Owner**”)

Re: The Drinking Water Supply located in Rocky View County, Alberta and municipally described as:

HeatherGlen Golf Club
SW 29 23 28 W4M

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted Drinking Water Supply pursuant to the provisions of the **Public Health Act**, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted Drinking Water Supply which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. The results of a water sample submitted on October 3, 2010 were of unacceptable microbiological quality, revealing the presence of Total Coliform and E. coli bacteria.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation, Alberta Regulation 243/2003 exist in about the above noted Drinking Water Supply, namely:

- a. The results of a water sample submitted on October 3, 2010 were of unacceptable microbiological quality, revealing the presence of Total Coliform and E. coli bacteria. This in contravention of the Nuisance and General Sanitation Regulation Section 11, which states “Where a person provided a source of water that the person intends to be used or realizes or ought to realize will be used by the public for human consumption, the person shall ensure that the water is potable”.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Food Regulation exist in and about the above noted Drinking Water Supply, namely:

- a. The results of a water sample submitted on October 3, 2010 were of unacceptable microbiological quality, revealing the presence of Total Coliform and E. coli bacteria. This is in contravention to Section 17(1)(f)(i) of the Food Regulation.

AND WHEREAS by virtue of the foregoing, the above noted Source of Water is hereby declared **unfit for human consumption**;

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately issue an Advisory to all users of the Drinking Water Supply HeatherGlen Golf Club to either boil water for at least one minute prior to consumption or to obtain an approved source of safe drinking water.
2. That the Owner undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted Drinking Water Supply, namely:
 - a. Post signage approved by Alberta Health Services at all water outlets accessible by the public stating that the water is not safe for human consumption.
 - b. Provide an approved hand sanitizer at all hand washing sinks for the disinfection of hands after they are washed.
 - c. Ensure that all food processing and preparation is done with potable water from an approved source or with water that has been boiled for at least one minute. This includes discontinuing the use of pop/juice fountains and ice machines supplied by the water source in question.
 - d. Ensure that all utensils, counter tops and food contact surfaces are cleaned and sanitized with an approved sanitizing step.
 - e. Repair the dishwasher to meet effective wash and sanitizing requirements.
 - f. Serve foods with single-use utensils only.
 - g. Install a locking protective cap over the potable water delivery connection that is accessible from the building exterior.
 - h. Conduct any necessary maintenance work on the existing drinking water system to render the water safe for human consumption.
 - i. Submit a water sample to the Provincial Laboratory for Public Health (Microbiology) for bacteriological testing.
3. The work referred to in paragraph **2(a) through 2(g)** must be completed immediately.
4. That, until such time as the work referred to in paragraph **2(h) and 2(i)** is completed and the Source of Water is shown to be potable to the satisfaction of the undersigned, or an executive officer of Alberta Health Services, and the results of the samples submitted under **2(h)** are determined to be satisfactory, this order shall remain in effect.

The Owner is advised that the Public Health Act empowers Alberta Health Services to carry out the terms of this Order on the Owner's behalf and at the Owner's expense should the Owner fail to comply with the terms hereof.
